Latest Fund Announced

Match Funding

- <u>BA Better World Community Fund</u> The funding is intended to support charities, community benefit societies and social enterprises in the UK with projects that creative positive impact across several categories:
- Environment.
- Diversity, inclusion, and wellbeing.
- Education and employability.
- Thriving communities.
- Grants of up to £50,000 can be awarded.

BA will match up to 50% of the money raised by groups through Crowdfunder, up to a maximum of £50,000.

 Women & Girls Match Fund - The Christmas Challenge 2022. The UK's biggest match funding campaign takes place from 29th November - 6th December. Applications open from 16th May - 1st July. Up to £25,000 in match funding is available per charity. Plus match funding of up to £10,000 available from the fund where hosted on the Big Give site.

Platinum Jubilee

Queen's Jubilee Fund Grant Scheme - To support local community and voluntary organisations and businesses to organise events and activities to celebrate the jubilee, Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council has launched the Queen's Jubilee Fund. The fund will enable will local organisations and businesses to access grant funding to cover some of the costs associated with delivering events and activities to mark the historic milestone.

Open Funds by Category



- Youth Music Trailblazer Fund Grants of £2,000 up to £30,000 are available to organisations in England to run projects for children and young people (aged 25 or under) to make, learn and earn in music.
- Historic England Everyday Heritage Grants Funding is intended to support diverse projects, heritage and stories which may have been previously overlooked, with a particular focus on the everyday lives of working people and communities. Grants of up to £25,000 are available. Smaller grassroots projects of less than £10,000 will be given priority for funding.



- <u>Parkinson's UK Physical Activity Grants Programme</u> Funding is intended to support
 community groups and organisations across the UK to develop new opportunities for
 people with Parkinson's to become and stay active or increase their levels of physical
 activity. Grants of between £500 and £2,500 are available. Applications must be
 submitted by the deadline of 10 June 2022 (12 noon).
- <u>The Happiness Fund</u> The Fund will support grassroots, not-for-profit projects across the UK with projects that aim to improve mental health and wellbeing, inclusion, and learning and skills development in local communities. This is a very small fund with four grants awarded each year. The funding available is £2,500 maximum per quarter, per project.
- <u>Benefact Trust Brighter Lives Mental Health Programme</u> This fund aims to support Christian organisations in responding to the long-term impact of COVID-19 on people's mental health and wellbeing, through greater training, resources, and support. There are no deadlines. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis while funding is still available.
- Motability Wheelchair Sector Grants The grant is available to UK non-profits to help disabled people by improving their access to good quality wheelchairs. Grants of £100,000 to £4 million are available for a maximum of three years. Applications can be made at any time.



- Hall and Woodhouse Community Chest Grants are intended to support charity and community interest companies who are working to improve their local communities. Grants of between £300 and £3,000 are available in 2022. The deadline to apply is the 1st July 2022.
- <u>Alpkit Foundation</u> The Foundation makes small awards to local groups and schools that work to remove the barriers in getting outdoors and experiencing wild places. Grants of between £50 and £500 are available for community groups, schools, and organisations.
- <u>Weinstock Fund</u> The trust is particularly interested in supporting charitable causes in the arts, community groups and projects, cultural and environmental causes, disability groups and charities supporting people with disabilities. Funding is at the discretion of the trustees. Typically grants range from £2,000 to £5,000. There are no application deadlines

CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

- <u>Kelly Family Charitable Trust</u> Funding for charities that work to tackle family problems can apply for grants of up to £5,000. Targeted at charities with an income under ½ million, and relatively new organisations. Grants for core funding are available.
- Oakland Foundation Grants are available to support projects targeted at children under the age of 16 years and their families who live in England and Wales focusing on the themes of education, health and nutrition, and sport. Applications are accepted from notfor-profit organisations and community groups in England and Wales.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- <u>Card Factory Foundation Community Grant Fund</u> This fund aims to support community projects and activities that improve lives, provide support for people undergoing lifechanging events, and provide benefit for both past and present Card Factory colleagues and communities where Card Factory stores operate. Grants are typically awarded up to £2,500.
- Warburtons Families Matter Small grants are available for local projects, activities and organisations that have charitable aims and that will be of real direct benefit to families. Community grants of up to £400 are available. The next deadlines are: 9th May 2022 and 8th August 2022.
- <u>SSEN Resilient Communities Fund</u> For 2022, projects supported by the fund must achieve one of the following criteria: Vulnerability To protect the welfare of vulnerable community members Resilience for Emergency Events To enhance community facilities, services, and communication.

SPORTS & LEISURE

- <u>Barclays Community Football Fund</u> The aim of the fund is to make playing football more accessible at the grassroots level, and in particular focused on including and inspiring girls and young people from lower socio-economic and under-represented groups, including culturally diverse communities, young people with disabilities, and young people from the LGBTQ+ community. Grants of £500 are available.
- Versus Arthritis Together Fund Grants are available for local community groups and organisations in England (outside London) to support activities that increase the availability of exercise opportunities for people with musculo-skeletal conditions, including arthritis. Grants of between £1,000 and £5,000 are available, which must be spent by the end of March 2023.

This Month's Top Tip:

Do Your Research

There are many funders out there with money to give. Look for foundations that share your values and explore the types of grants typically given to support causes like yours. You should also pay attention to grant requirements including which groups and projects may qualify for funding, proposal length and format, application deadlines, and disbursal dates.
